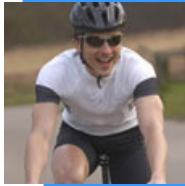

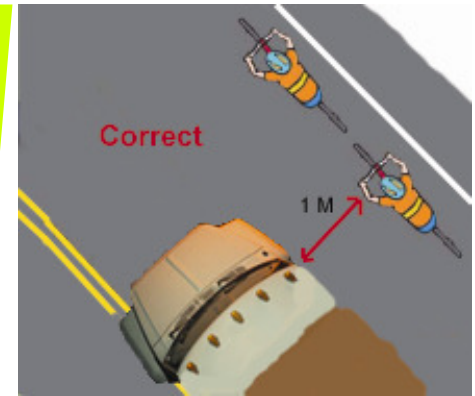

Watch out for Cyclists

Cyclists have the same rights
and duties as a driver
of a vehicle!



Drivers..

Safe Driving Tips...

- When a cyclist is in your lane or is coming toward you in the opposite lane on a two-lane road or Hwy, avoid passing if both vehicles and the cyclist would meet at the same time
- When passing you should leave at least one meter between your vehicle and a cyclist on the highway
- Cyclists are not required to cycle on any part of a highway that is not paved
- Be aware that cyclists will sometimes ride to the left of the white line if there is no shoulder, or if the shoulder is unsafe to cycle on
- Road Rage is dangerous and can kill!

Safe Riding Tips...



The most common bicycle/motor vehicle collisions are:

- An oncoming driver turns left in front of the cyclist.
- A driver on a cross street stops, and then pulls out directly in front of the cyclist.
- A driver barely passes the cyclist and then turns right.

On a typical day four cyclists are injured in BC

... So Be Aware when You are Riding!



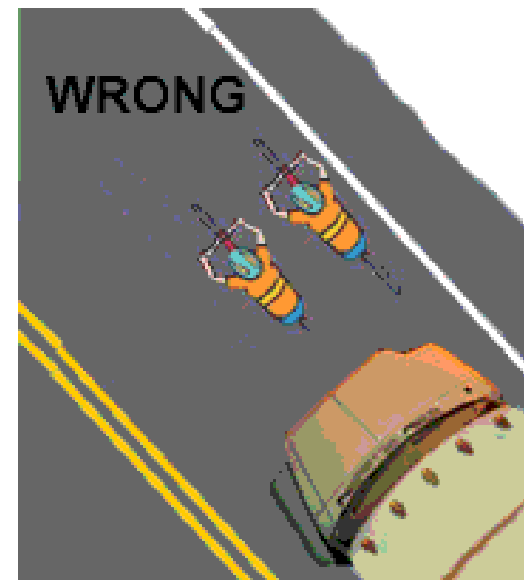
Tips:

- **Be Visible**
- **Be Predictable**
- **Use Signals**
- **Wear a helmet**
- **Some vehicles have blind spots and can't see you**
- **Use bike lanes when available and shoulders where possible**

Know the law before you ride!

Cyclists have the same rights and duties as a driver of a vehicle!

- Cyclists must not ride abreast of another person riding a bike on a roadway
- Ride as near as practicable to the right side of the highway
- Cyclists are not required to cycle on any part of a highway that is not paved
- Cyclists are required to use hand signals when changing lanes, turning, stopping or, slowing down
- Cyclists must wear a helmet
- Cyclists must use a headlight and taillight when riding at night
